## THE KNIGHT - CARD #1





The messenger, is one of the Orixas from the African pantheon in Candomble; a Afro Brazilian religion. He is the guardian of temples, homes and people. He is also the executioner of karmic justice and acts on the desobstruction of material and spiritual paths.



### THE CLOVER - CARD #2



**European meaning** - Luck, good outcome, opportunity, bargain, gamble, lottery.

**Brazilian meaning** - Obstacles to be overcome. Something in your way that can slow you down, but cannot stop you. Small obstacles, which can be overcomed. Delayed solutions. Combined with the Tree, it speaks of some waiting before reaching the goal. Don't be intimidated by small mishaps. Stay calm, focused and do your job. Clear your path and move on. In the end, there is some learning to be done, adding something good to your life.

#### Brazilian Lenormand

Some Lenormans decks that are published in Brazil, show the card #2 featuring a picture of logs in the middle of a road.

### THE SHIP - CARD #3



Similar meaning for European and Brazilian schools. Positive changes. Moves for the better. Trips with a positive result. Combined with The House #4 card, house moving. Combined with The Book card, work or study trip. Still, the Ship combined to the card # 26 The Book may also be a change of a job position for the better, with promotion. This card always brings positive changes, with growth and prosperity. The water element showing in the card, traditionally symbolizes movement and prosperity.

# IEMANJÁ

Iemanjá is the mother of all beings. She is the one that welcomes and blesses everyone. The name lemanja means "the mother whose children are fish". She is the patron for the family and home



## THE TREE - CARD #5



Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools. Prosperity after a certain period of time. A period of time before the harvest. Warning to be carefull, "sow your seeds for a bountiful harvest". To be aware of the quality of what you are planting to reap the expected result. Attention to the stages of the process. Planning something carefully, following a strategy and having a good harvest as a result. Prosperity and sure harvest. Patience. The stages of life: spring, summer, fall and winter. Long life, good physical structure, good health..

## OXOSS

Oxossi is the hunter and the medicine man. He is also the patron of the arts, wisdom, abundance, knowledge and intelligence. He is the great hunter of souls, the mentor and the wise man. Also, the Lord of the woods, forests, animals and everything that lives in it. This Orixa is connected to the earth element.



### THE CLOUDS - CARD #6




Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools. Those changes that you want are coming to you at all costs! Achievement of desired results even with some unexpected consequences. Anxiety, stress,impatience. Light after a time of darkness. Resolution after difficulties and uncertainties. A new day after hardship. Change of situation in the desired and expected direction. Have hope and faith, but beware of anxiety.

## ANSA

lansa is the Orixa for the winds, lightning, hurricanes, cyclones, storms, weather, bamboo groves. She is the patron of the fights and the warriors. Lady of the underworld and the dead but also Goddess of the passions. She has the strength of the buffalo and the butterfly lightness.



#### THE SERPENT - CARD #7



Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools. Wisdom, focus, upward development. Watch out and don't be carried away by illusions. Beware of promises of easy earnings. Be wary of contracts and deals that have not yet materialized. Do not count on what is not concrete. "The rainbow is beautiful, but it's just an optical illusion." There is no pot of gold at the end of the rainbow, there is only disappointment. Only trust what is concrete, palpable. Contradictory and unbalanced energies. Protect yourself and prevent yourself from fraud, promises that will not be fulfilled and illusions.

## OXUMARE

Oxumare is the Orixa for mobility, cycles, dexterity, flexibility, infinity, ambivalence, fortune, wealth, prosperity. He is represented by a serpent.





# THE BOUQUET OR THE FLOWERS - CARD #9

Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools. Happiness, enthusiasm, celebration. Gifts received with joy. Good news. Good results. Parties. Fun. Pleasures.

## NANA

Nana is the oldest among the Orixas. She is the patron of maturity, and protects the elderly. This Goddess is the archetype of the old woman, the grandmother, the lady of the portal, owner of the mangroves, swamps and mud. She is responsible for sweeping all diseases, illnesses and harmful energies into the depths of her waters. One of her symbols is the broom. Nana is the sweetness of the grandmother but also the austerity and severity that comes with old age



### THE SCYTHE - CARD #10



Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools.

Fear of cutting down the old to plant the new. Something being taken from you. Mowing, cleaning, letting go of what has already passed so that a new stage can be built. Be aware that it is necessary to cut relationships, forget events and situations, get rid of memories, creeds and behaviors. Clear life of what no longer works and move forward without fear of starting over.

The difference between The Scythe, card 10 and The Coffin, card 8; is that the coffin is involuntary and unexpected. The coffin is a moment of endings regardless of your will. The Scythe on the other hand, is up to you. You must start cutting and leaving behind what no longer fits in your life. With The Coffin, card 8, endings and cuts happen in your life naturally and independently of your will. With The Scythe, card 10 you must finish and cut what no longer serves you in your life. The action depends on you.

## OBALUAE

Obaluae, the young warrior or Omulu, the elder sorcerer. He is the Orixa responsible for epidermal diseases, plagues, and their cures. His name means "The Lord of the earth and life". He is the king of the earth, lord of health and healing of physical and soul ailments. He is the master of magic, responsible for transmutation, for the changes in the cycles of life. He also governs death and life. His realms are the cemeteries and the abyssal regions in the bottom of the sea. Omulu does not cause diseases, he takes it away and returns it to the earth. He is the Orixá that sends mercy for the sick.




#### THE CHILD - CARD #13





Therefore, they are associated with the sources of rivers, purity, germination and everything that is born. They are twins and so are also related to duality.




### THE BEAR - CARD #15

### THE GARDEN - CARD #20




**Brazilian meaning** - Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools.

Xango is the Orixá of justice. Lord of lightning, fire, thunder, quarries, knowledge, power, strength,. He inspires us to have balance in our decisions. He is who draws up the sentence for Ogun and Exu to execute the law. He is firm as a rock.



### THE PATH - CARD #22



**Brazilian meaning** - Same meaning for European and Brazilian schools.

Freedom of choice. Paths to be trodden with courage. More than one option to choose from, but achieving the same positive/desired result. Walk your path and find the light at the end of the tunnel. Opportunities. Choices.

Ogum is known in some legends as the older brother of the Orixas Oxossi and Exu, who are sons of Iemanja. Ogun is the orixá of the paths, he is present in all the realms of the other orixás. He is the patron of agriculture, technology. He is the blacksmith, the soldier, the commander, the warrior. Ogum is also skilled in combating harmful magic. He also represents perseverance and tenacity, drive and energy.



#### THE BOOK - CARD #26



Brazilian meaning - Studies, reasoning, intellectual intelligence, tests, exams, documents.


Work and study. Professional progress. Progress in studies.

## OXUM

Oxum is Oxala's daughter and one of Xango's wives. She is responsible for fertility, motherhood and the female womb. The patron of newborns. She is the goddess of waterfalls, rivers and freshwater. Goddess of beauty and love, compassion, gold, wealth and prosperity. She is the orixá that looks over pregnancy, motherhood, fertility and children. Oxum is linked to the element of water.



#### THE SUN - CARD #31





A new day of success and prosperity. Health. Spiritual openness. Vision opening, clarification. Clear view of the situation. Connection with the Divine. Ideas leading to progress. Progress in every way. Leadership. Competitiveness. Vanity. Tyranny. Narcissism.

## OXALA

Oxala is known as the King of the "white cloth" or "the creation" itself. He is Peace, faith, light, ethics, creation, cosmic synthesis. Oxala is the father of all orixás. He is the masculine, the beginning and the end, life and death.




### THE CROSS - CARD #36
